HIGHLIGHTS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

My public health career of over 50 years started in Canada as a family physician and later as Deputy Minister of Health in Manitoba (1971-76). After immigrating to Israel in 1976, I joined the Ministry of Health as head of public health in 1977, and then appointed Coordinator of Health in the West Bank and Gaza (1980-1994). I worked on water quality introducing mandatory chlorination, the immunization system, Rift Valley Fever, occupational health and nutrition.

I worked for some 20 years with health of the Palestinian population of the West Bank and Gaza as the Israeli Ministry of Health supervisor of health matters, and especially on vaccination policy, primary health care, nutrition and training programs, until and in a coordinative role following the transfer of responsibility for health to the Palestinian Authority in 1994. I also worked on growth studies of children, leading to the Palestinian Authority mandating micronutrient fortification of flour.

I taught at the Braun School of Public Health International MPH program continuously since 1982 and retired in 2016. I found this stimulating and I learned a lot from the interchange with students from around the world including teaching and supervising masters papers.

I have published 110 articles in peer reviewed journals on public health topics including many infectious disease policies, maternal and child health of the Palestinian population as well as occupational health (mesothelioma), geriatric care and genetic disorders (thalassemia), anemia, micronutrient deficiency conditions.

In the 1985-1992, I was consultant and visiting professor each year for 3-6 weeks at the State University New York at Albany School of Public Health with teaching and project activities including development of community health workers for HIV, TB and other public health functions. I led an investigation of deaths from Hemorrhagic Disease of Newborns in New York State leading to a publication and adoption of mandatory vitamin K injections for all newborns in the state, which was followed by adoption in all other US States.

In 1997-98, I spent a sabbatical year at UCLA School of Public Health teaching and working on developing a community health worker project in low income housing projects.

In the 1990s I was a consultant to the World Bank and later the Open Society Institute in many schools of public health across Russia (Moscow, Chelyabinsk, Tver, and St Petersburg) as well as in Central Europe (Macedonia, Moldova, Albania and Georgia), and in Central Asia (Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan and Mongolia).

With a Russian colleague, in 2009 we published *The New Public Health* a textbook meant for Russian schools but also published in English by Academic Press/Elsevier in three editions and used widely in Israel, in Europe and North America. It has been published in other languages (Uzbek, Bulgarian, Romanian, Macedonian, Mongolian, Albanian and Georgian). This includes visits, continuing contact regarding training at the MPH level, Visiting Faculty Programs at the Braun School of Public Health and

summer schools in Russia for 4 consecutive years. and visiting lectures (Russia, Albania, Macedonia, Moldova primarily).

In the period 2000 to 2008, I worked with US Academy of Sciences and other organizations on Palestinian nutrition issues, including micronutrient deficiency conditions, monitoring of nutritional status and on communicable disease control. This helped lead to the decision of the Palestinian Authority to mandate fortification of flour with vitamins B, iron, Vitamin A and folic acid.

Between 2004 to 2008, I served on the Executive Board of the Association of Schools of public health in the European Region (ASPHER). I was chair of the Ethics and Undergraduate Education Working Groups of ASPHER and assisted in development of the European Accreditation Agency for Schools of Public Health. I also worked on the Israeli Ministry of Health Healthy Israel 2020 section on nutrition.

Since 2010, I have served as Deputy Editor of *Public Health Reviews* and am currently head of a school of health professions including a BA program in public health at Ashkelon College, a first in Israel.

I am currently writing a **Casebook of Public Health** contracted to be published by Elsevier Press in 2017, and invited to prepare a chapter on Health in Israel of a book on Middle East health.
